School Expectations of Sixth Form Students

Sixth Form students provide a visible bridge between the younger students in years 7-11 and the teachers in the school. With this in mind we expect students in the Sixth Form to take leadership in this area and demonstrate that they are supporting the school in its aspiration towards high standards in all areas.

We all know that fashions change over time such that a prescriptive list of acceptable / unacceptable clothing, jewellery and hairstyles is challenging. The general rule of thumb is that if you wouldn't wear it to an interview, don't wear it to school. If you are in clothing that is in our opinion inappropriate for an interview, then you will be asked to adjust your appearance in school; if this is not possible you will have to return home to change.

The final decision as to what is, or is not, appropriate dress, lies with the Heads of Sixth Form.

Suitable Styles

	Coats	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Outdoor coats can be worn to and from school in the event of inclement weather
General		<ul style="list-style-type: none">Subtle make-upSubtle earringsSingle small nose stud piercingA student who, for religious reasons, wears a head covering must ensure that it is no longer than shoulder length in plain black or navy blue. The white shirt must be visible.

Guidance

The list below gives guidance to unsuitable styles. This list is not exhaustive, and the final decision lies with the Head of Sixth Form.

Jumper	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Hoodies (Y13 may wear a leavers' hoodie during their last 2 weeks)• Gilets• Sweatshirt• Polo neck• Black styles with adornments, e.g. logos, diamante, etc.
Coats	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Hoodies• Leather jackets• Denim jackets in any colour
General	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Extreme hairstyles e.g. green, pink, half shaved• No nose rings• No other facial piercings• No outdoor clothing, other than the suitable dress code described here, should be worn in lessons
